CHILDREN'S MINISTRY UPDATE

The Craft Hut was a busy and fun place to be each day during our Surf Shack VBS.

Every day we made a craft project and we worked on our mission project.

We made scratch art crosses, colorful sand art, seashell prayer cards for those unable to come to church, a fish necklace, colorful jellyfish and a lifesaver necklace. The cross is a reminder of our Savior's great love for us and our call to follow him; the seashell reminds us that as we hear the sea in the shell, so God hears our prayers; the fish has Biblical significance (Jesus told his disciples to be "fishers of men," performed miracles involving fish, helped the disciples to catch fish, etc.); the lifesaver necklace reminds us that Jesus is our lifesaver.



Our mission project this year at VBS was making 250 "Dignity Bags" for the homeless in our community, to be distributed through MorningStar Mission. We decorated lunch bags, filled Ziploc bags with toiletry items, and made up laundry bags containing detergent and a dryer sheet. We had fun making up both the "Soapy Waters" bags and the "Dignity Bags," knowing that helping our friends right here in our own community is one way we can share God's love. All the bags were delivered to MorningStar Mission last week.



Our Thursday night, following songs and the program in the sanctuary for our families, we had a big Beach Party in our parking lot. We celebrated a wonderful week of outreach to the children in our community with Food, Games, Fellowship, and FUN. Thank you to all our volunteers—you helped 178 children experience God's amazing presence in their lives!

House children are now attending Sunshine Springs Academy, about 15 miles north of Tarime on the border of Kenya and Tanzania. The teachers at Sunshine have made a huge difference in the academic lives of the children. They are now learning English as early as Kindergarten. The Kenyan school year is divided into three terms, with 3 months on followed by 1 month off. During their time off, they often work in the garden in the early morning, and spend the afternoon learning how to sew. During the August break, they'll begin using Microsoft Word and have typing lessons.

You've heard this many times...personal invitations work best. Whether it is to a party you are hosting, or a gala celebrationvery few people just show up to a party, event and yes, even church, without some kind of invitation. Thom Rainer offers the following example (paraphrased) from the perspective of someone who might be interested in a church: I have visited many churches. It's hard though...not knowing anybody. I'd really like to know more about being a Christian. I am not in a church but I'm interested. My co-worker goes to church. I even know where he is a member. But...he's never invited me. My neighbor goes to church. My children play with her children. I see their family go to church every Sunday. But...she's never invited me. I would go if she did.
