LOVE DOES SERMON SERIES AND STUDIES

On Sunday, January 8, we begin an 8-Week Sermon Series on "Love Does." It's based on the foundation of Love God and Love Neighbor – in that order. Love is practical. Love takes action...Love Does! We will be using Bob Goff's book, *Love Does*, as we take a fresh look at what it means to love God and love others.

Here's where we are going with this series.

Sunday, January 8 — "With You"—Matthew 18:20, John 1:9-14, Philippians 2:5-11. Bob Goff, "I used to want to fix people, but now I just want to be with them."

In the weeks to come we will explore these fresh insights about what love looks like in real life.

"Succeeding at What Doesn't Matter?" Bob Goff writes, "I used to be afraid of failing at something that really mattered to me, but now I'm more afraid of succeeding at things that don't matter."

"Never Give Up...On...." Bob Goff writes, "I used to think God guided us by opening and closing doors, but now I know sometimes God wants us to kick some doors down."

"Lasting Impact." Bob Goff writes, "I used to think that I needed to sacrifice for God, but now I know faith is like a game of Bigger and Better."

"Real Faith." Bob Goff writes, "I used to think religion tasted horrible, but now I know I was just eating the fake stuff."






Saturday, January 28 Set-up at 4:30 p.m. Tasting begins @ 5:00 p.m. Movies begin @ 6:00 p.m.

You may lose a deduction for some contributions if you file your tax return before receiving this written acknowledgment from the church.

It's easy to support the life, mission and ministry of First Presbyterian Church. Here are the guidelines for On-Line Giving and Text Giving. Donations to special offerings such as mission projects and the Christmas Joy Offering (which helps our Night Deacons feed the hungry in our community) can also be made on-line and by text giving.

<u>On-Line Giving</u>: Go to our website—firstpresjoliet.org— and click on the "Give" box at the top of the home page. You can plug in your user e-mail address and set up a password. On-Line Giving can be used for an occasional payment when you are out of town or for automatic recurring giving or for special offerings.

<u>Text Giving</u>: Text an amount to 815-205-3044. The first time you text a donation, you will be prompted with a one-time registration screen. This will assign your mobile number to First Pres., and allow you to select what account your text donation is withdrawn from. All subsequent donations will simply be texting the amount to First Pres. (which can be saved for easy access in your phone's contact list). You will get a text confirmation that your donation was successful.

Social Media...What Is It and Why Do We Need It?

Facebook...Twitter...Instagram...Snapchat...each of these are part of a broad category called social media. Let's face it...it is almost 2017 and social media is a reality. But what is it? I think it is easier to describe it this way: the "social" part: refers to interacting with other people by sharing information with them and receiving information from them. The "media" part: refers to an instrument of communication, like the internet (while TV, radio and newspapers are examples of more traditional forms of media). In short, social media are web-based communication tools that enable people to interact with each other by both sharing and consuming information.

Social Media also allows First Pres., and all those who interact with social media, a way to tell thousands in our community what is going on at the church. For example, this past Christmas we were able to use social media, in addition to traditional media like the newspaper, to tell people about the Cantata, Christmas Eve and Day services. Those of you with Facebook accounts, for instance, were able to take the ad we created and SHARE it on your Facebook page—thus increasing our reach, called ENGAGEMENT, in the community. Engagement means that we are communicating with people in a way that gets them to pay attention, which increases our possibility of attracting someone to whatever it is we are promoting.

Social media relies on YOU, the user, to help spread the word of whatever is going on at the church. When you LIKE a page or a picture or post on Facebook, your Facebook friends have the opportunity to see it. When you COMMENT, the same is true, only now you are adding a personal touch which further adds in connecting with others in a way that can get them to pay attention. The overall idea behind a church using social media and relying on its members to help through ENGAGEMENT forms the initial groundwork of relationship development. Clearly, personal, face to face invitations will always remain the best way of engaging others in our neighborhoods and places of work. SOCIAL MEDIA, though, is the surest link to individuals under 45 years of age today. Look for more insights related to SOCIAL MEDIA in the future. — Pastor Dale
