



Can you think of a time when you experienced something so big that it made a big difference in your life? I remember being in my first year in Seminary back in Romania, and during the summer of that year we got involved in Vacation Bible School. For a couple weeks, we ran a VBS where lots of kids came to hear about Jesus, to sing, play and have fun. I keep thinking of what that summer meant to me. It shaped my ministry vision, it helped me see the importance of reaching the kids, and sharing that God loves them and has a plan for their lives. Every year since, I am amazed at the things God is doing during VBS. From kids stepping out of their way to help others, to volunteers stepping out in faith, to planting those seeds of faith...all that happens in one magical week. It is not by accident, it is not by chance; but it's because of prayer, standing on God's promise and the vision that every kid and their family is loved by God. So I am asking you to pray, to join us, and to make VBS another week when, as a community, we make a lasting impact in someone's life. This year we are joining many other churches in a trip to the Maker Fun Factory, a world where curious kids become hands-on inven-

tors who discover they're lovingly

crafted by God.



At the time of this writing, I have been working at First Pres. for just over a month. If I have one take away from that time it is that sometimes Christians, especially youth, always try to search for a solution to small problems in their lives; for example, if I give up social media, I will be less stressed about what other people are doing, or if I spend more time focusing on my walk with God, I will find peace in my life. These searches always seem to end in vain for many reasons, namely lack of motivation and more importantly, many times these small symptoms being treated won't cure the disease that is ailing people. Many times people rely on themselves to fix their problems without going to God for the help they truly need.

I say all that to get up on my soapbox and say that I think the practice of giving things up for Lent almost never achieves the goal the practice was created for. Most of the time giving things up for Lent is seen as a way to get closer to God by using the time you would normally spend doing the thing you gave up to pray, read your bible, etc. I have seen many people use this as a way to restart that diet that was originally a New Year's resolution or pat themselves on the back and make a big deal on how they gave up something that is seen as impossible to give up by many, such as television or more recently social media. I am, of course, not saying that this is everyone; there are many people I have met who have used that time to get closer to God and have an effective Lent. However, coming from the youth perspective, it is hard not to sometimes see Lent as an obligation to give up something or a moment to flaunt how honorable they are being giving something up.

That being said, Lent can be a very moving experience for many people. Perhaps instead of giving up chocolate and devoting the time you would have spent eating chocolate to get closer to God, you spend the forty days of Lent doing a devotion each day that ends with eating a piece of chocolate to help keep you motivated to finish. The truly important thing, however, is that you keep doing something to remain close to God after Lent is over. If you just do something for the forty days of Lent and then stop, it seems more of an obligation then a true experience of coming closer to God.

"Failure is not an option..."



This quote came from the movie Apollo 13 and is a good introduction to providing an update on the C4 Men's Ministry at First Pres. Sometimes in life it takes a couple of attempts to get things going. But...if it is a good thing and there are a few who think it's worth fighting for...well, then you keep going after it until you get it right!! Just ask Adam Halatek, Ed Schultz, Bob Becker, Jeff Kasper, Wayne Zoellick, Mike House, Bo Mircea and myself – eight of the nine men on the C4 leadership team who came together on February 12th (Matt Blaser had a conflict) to look at why we have stalled and what we

could do to move forward. No one is claiming victory yet because this is a very long journey to reach all of the men at First Pres.; however, we did talk about some tough things that are holding us back, like: commitment, the daily grind of life, getting distracted, etc.

While we looked back, we know that we need to look forward and challenge ourselves and pray that God will bless this ministry at First Pres. With that in mind, we set some realistic and challenging near term goals:

Because Christ is our central focus, the C4 Men decided they wanted a men's only discussion group to work on what they believe – we will be using Adam Hamilton's book and DVD "*Creed*" to guide us during Lent (see the "Growing in Christ" page).

The C4 leadership team will commit to meeting monthly using Scripture and prayer to guide our direction and progress...the next meeting is March 26th after second service. The C4 leadership team will focus on creating a Men's Retreat for the fall of 2017.

You, too, can help the men at First Pres. by praying for this important ministry – for the leadership team that they will be guided by God and his Word and that the men of First Pres. would come to know this group as an important part of their lives.
