"Look To Jesus" Lenten Sermon Series. During the Season of Lent we are focusing upon the Life, Ministry, and Person of Jesus Christ. The Sermon Series for Lent is "Look to Jesus" and is based upon the Eight Servant Values: S.E.R.V.A.N.T.S. - Spirit-Filled, Empathy, Renewal, Visibly Seeking Out, All Together, Nearing God, Teaching, and Submission. These Values of Jesus found in the New Testament help us appreciate more fully who Jesus is and what it means to follow him. There are booklets in the Lobby/Narthex of the church which describe each Servant Value and provide scripture passages for each one. It's a good devotional for the Lenten Season.

Feed My Starving Children was a great experience. Last Saturday 40 of us gathered at Trinity Christian School in Shorewood to participate in packing "Manna Pack" dry food packets (13.3 oz.), which provide 6 cups of food when cooked with water. Each packet is a combination of rice, soy, vegetables, and vitamins specially designed to eliminate the effects of malnutrition. We saw our church's mission contribution of \$2,000 put to work to help malnourished children all over the world. Another 119 packers from other churches joined us for the 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. shift. Together we packed over 24,000 meals, which will support 66 children with food for an entire year. It was an awesome time, and everyone was asking about doing this again. Thanks everyone!
