



# Children's Ministry Update

If you are like me, you might find yourself reading the news or exploring a blog and kind of get lost in it. This happened to me again recently; I got lost in following a series of articles about church and participation, especially young families' church participation.

And I have to share with you—the authors I was reading shared their concerns once again about the things that we are facing as churches these days. Many of these concerns were, as you guys might guess, centered on the busyness of our lives and the way this impacts attendance. But even more so the question of why is the church through its presence in the life of the believers so important. A few years back I wrote something about why it is important to be part of a church family and participate in a meaningful way, and I think it is still relevant today:

It supports godly parenting. The church was never meant to be the exclusive faith teacher of children. Instead, God's plan was for the church and family to form a partnership.

It helps you into more faithful attendance. Usually parents become more involved in the church when their kids become more involved in the children's ministry.

It helps new families get connected with the church. Even when a new family comes into the church, they still need help to get plugged in.

It helps dads get involved in the church. For various reasons, fathers have a difficult time getting connected with the church family. One great way to bridge this gap is to use kids' ministries as a place to connect and know some other dads.

It provides families with meaningful shared experiences. This is true especially when the whole family can participate in events like VBS or summer camp.

It helps answers those hard questions. Almost every week a child will come to me with a religious question that has stumped their parents.

With the summer ahead of us, I pray that we can all experience that feeling of being rested and refreshed that the summer brings, but I also pray that we can take time and worship together, serve and spend time with our faith family. Have a great summer and see you on Sunday.





### **"Relationships: Can I find real community here?"**

People want real community today and many come looking for it in the church. I'm not talking about just being friendly. Friendly is fairly easy to do...smiling face, warm handshake, a kind hello. Book after book has been written (and continues to be written) about individuals who are looking for real relationships...deep, authentic relationships. They are looking for relationships where there is true concern, compassion and deep caring for others. We find this in the first church where, "All the believers were united and shared everything. They would sell pieces of property and possessions and distribute the proceeds to everyone who needed them. Every day, they met together in the temple and ate in their homes. They shared food with gladness and simplicity. They praised God and demonstrated God's goodness to everyone. The Lord added daily to the community those who were being saved." (Acts 2:42-47)

**This, simply, is the idea behind going out to lunch after church on Sunday, June 11** – developing community through authentic relationships. Finally, since so many want rules about how to do things....

Admit that you like to eat.

Be okay with meeting new people.

Commit to going out to breakfast, brunch or lunch after your favorite worship service on Sunday, June 11.
