At its regularly scheduled meeting of June 8, 2017, the Session of First Presbyterian Church, Joliet, voted:

—to approve any baptisms that may be requested before the next meeting;

—to approve the purchase of 42 new choir robes and stoles at a cost of \$7,500 to replace worn robes;

— to accept all confirmands of the class of 2017 into membership;

—to move the next Session Meeting from August 10 to Thursday, August 17, 2017, to avoid schedule conflicts;

—to hold a Feed My Starving Children Packing Session in the fall, at a cost of about \$22,000, cost to be offset by personal donations and by recruiting other churches to pick up part of the cost and provide volunteers (500 needed);

—to pre-purchase 250 tickets at a cost of \$2,500 to the Joliet Slammers Faith Night game on August 26 in support of the mission work of The Center by Milton Calvin, a local Christian singer and musician;

—to approve a freewill offering at the Jazz Concert to be held July 12, with proceeds to benefit the work of the Joliet Chapter of Pink Heals, a group that supports families in crisis.
