"Bible Perspectives" Sundays, 10:15 to 11:15 a.m. Room 201 with Jim Mullins



Looking beyond Easter Sunday.....

We all love Easter, between the Sunday morning service and the family gathering for a meal and the excitement of finding the most eggs, adults and kids alike look forward to this day. It is that constant reminder that rebirth, new life in Christ, is ours when we trust in the Lord, who overcame death on the cross so that we can walk in the freedom that faith brings. Because in that proclamation we all can learn about hope, about God's love for us, and that even in difficult times we are not alone.

So take time to Celebrate, Rejoice and Proclaim that each day for us as believers is a brand new Easter Morning!
