Our Boards for the Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations are back up in the Narthex/ Lobby Area. We moved them out for the Advent-Christmas Season. But now they are back, as they are significant to us for our life, ministry, and mission. What is happening? The session has been working and giving thoughtful reflection on all of the suggestions (Post-It Notes) provided by the congregation and elders. You will see that the more important Post-It Note Idea/Suggestions have been placed higher on the boards. This means the session teams are giving higher priority to those suggestions. They are also arranging them together in clusters when they have a clear relationship to each other.
