#### The what:

#### The why:

Jesus calls us all to go out into the world and spread the Good News. For teen-agers, this is an intimidating call. While they are trying to navigate the world of school, social statuses, and interpersonal development, the call from Jesus is just another thing they must add to their massive pile of stresses. Harder yet, this call has potential to alienate them from peers. Mission Trips are designed to put students together with other believers so that they can see they are not alone in loving and choosing Jesus; while at the same time, they are able to serve Jesus the way that He's asked everyone of us to follow Him.

#### And what are the students doing?

Senior High Students: July 7-July 14 our senior high students will be heading to Pocahontas, VA, to help repair homes for a town in need of the love of Jesus. The homes we will be working on will be low income homes, and let us not forget that Jesus has called us to care for the least of these! People in poverty are so often glanced over and this week will be an excellent opportunity for our students to not only help them, but to engage with a population that they may never have met before!

Junior High Students: A few weeks after the senior high trip (dates are still to be determined) our Junior High students will spend three days at FPJ where they will learn the value of helping their home church, and will experience volunteer opportunities right here in Joliet (Spanish Community Center, Joliet Hope Center, and another organization not yet decided on). The three days spent locally aim to show students that the mission field is eve-

**SUNDAY, February 3.** This is our final Sunday for our "Run Your Race" Sermons Series. We look once more at how we follow the Lord Jesus in our Race of Faith. Are we present to the One who is present to us? Are we listening to

OUR BOARDS FOR THE FIVE PRACTICES OF FRUITFUL CONGREGATIONS are back up in the Narthex/Lobby Area. We moved them out for the Advent-Christmas Season. But now they are back as they are significant to us for our life, ministry, and mission.

What is happening? The session has been working and giving thoughtful reflection on all of the suggestions (Post-It Notes) provided by the congregation and elders. They are also arranging them together in clusters when they have a clear relationship to each other. The Post-It Notes that have been placed lower on the board have less priority right now and are in the "parking lot." They are still there in case their priority changes as the planning process goes on. Yet some will remain there.

What can you do? One thing you can do is to identify any ministry-mission suggestions you want to help work on by writing your name on that particular Post-It Note. You can invite another person to do that with you so you have two people interested in helping make that ministry-mission suggestion a reality.

- —to hold a second Congregational Meeting on Sunday, January 20, 2019, to change the bylaws to reflect that more than one youth elder or deacon may be elected for a 1 year term; and to elect Colin Becker, Lilly Dunbar and Hunter Belfield as Deacons; —to accept Mark Fumagalli, Laura Wakefield, and Diane Seeman (on letter of transfer from Elwood Presbyterian Church) into membership of First Presbyterian Church of Joliet;

## Children's Ministry Update

Today I am still thinking about Deut. 6:4-7.

"Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is One. And you shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength.

These words I am commanding you today are to be upon your hearts. And you shall teach them diligently to your children and speak of them when you sit in your house and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up."

To love the Lord with all your heart... That seems to be one of the common motifs we see in the Scripture, as our response to God's grace, as a way to show our faithfulness. Sometimes I wish that Jesus would have said more to his disciples about how to love God, and what that means. Moses surely had something in mind when he spoke to the Israelites and put the future of their faith in their hands. It is that responsibility of sharing our faith with the next generation that has me motivated in the things I do. But I also have the recognition that the church alone cannot and will not be able to change the world of tomorrow without all of us committing to it.

Today I want to encourage you to love the Lord with all your heart, and to love those around you with all

that you have, to be ready to share and tell the story of God and of your faith with them.

Children look at you and me to be examples, not just in day to day living, but also for their faith.

I pray that every day of our lives we will be given the chance to share our faith and speak about the love God has for the world.


