On this Second Sunday of Lent we continue our study of the Sermon on the Mount. I am preaching on “Prayer and Fasting: Let Go of the Show—Simplify.” In Chapter 6 of Matthew, Jesus is teaching about Giving, Praying, and Fasting. The common theme is not to let our giving, praying, and fasting be done in a way that is about creating a big show. Our service is not about putting the spotlight on ourselves to show everyone just how good we are, but to give glory and honor to God who sees all things and knows our heart. It seems that, in Jesus' times, there were Pharisees who wanted everyone to see their visible goodness and faithfulness to God. It was inauthentic and publicly so.

We committed to supporting them through High School. It's so good to see them growing up at Angel House Mission in a loving and caring place where Christ's love is shared and education is valued. In effect, they have an extended family through Angel House Mission and through our support. Each year we raise \$4,680 to support Bhoke, Rhobi, and Lucia.
