We will journey through some of the most familiar teachings of Jesus from Matthew Chapters 5-7. As we study these passages, we will relate them to the events surrounding Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. In the process, our worship services will reveal that the cross itself is the ultimate sermon on the mount for our journey of faith in this special and sacred season.

We gather in worship this first Sunday in Lent, continuing our journey in the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew's Gospel. Pastor Bo starts us off on Ash Wednesday with the Beatitudes and "Blessed are You." This week we move to "Salt and Light," an interesting combination of metaphors used by Jesus in teaching his disciples. In this season of Lent, we look backwards knowing what Jesus has done for his followers in order for us to be able to move forward and answer two questions: Who are we? What are we to do? 
