Summer College Bible Study

TwentySomeone by Craig Dunham and Doug Serven is a book made for those who are in their 20's. They subtitled the book "Finding yourself in a decade of transition." This study aims to be a place where young adults can step back from those questions and use their 20's to answer a bigger one that will help all the others fall into place: Who am I?

The book is filled with personal experiences from the authors and will help you discover who God is calling you to be.

Who's invited? While this began as an idea for college ministry, the book is directed toward all those in their 20's. We are inviting everyone who is graduating high school this spring to those who are 29!

When will it be? Wednesday nights beginning June 5 at 7:30 p.m. We will begin by meeting in the Youth Lounge at First Pres.—the one located on the second floor next to the choir room.

What do I need? You need to purchase the book *TwentySomeone* by Craig Dunham and Doug Serven and bring a notebook!

What's the study look like? We will read one chapter from the book a week and Karissa has created journaling/ discussion questions that correspond with the reading from that week. While you'll do a lot of the reading and writing at home on your own, your answers will be crucial for our discussion! Have you ever felt like you are the only one struggling? By creating an atmosphere of honesty and transparency, you'll soon find you are far from alone!

Each Wednesday night that we meet will be filled with fellowship, laughter, discussion, and prayer. Karissa has a few classically cheesy ice-breakers to get the ball rolling, too!
