# Children's Ministry News

Are you ready for summer? I know that most parents are, and I am pretty sure that kids are just waiting for time off school. Kids are already on the baseball fields or playing soccer and doing all kinds of things that will keep parents and kids always on the run, so to speak. So, I thought that before vacation starts, I would share with you a few things you might consider as you get ready for summer.



Worship regularly. We all agree that life can be busy and sometimes plans change—team schedules or extra practices, etc. Things like that just happen. But worshipping together as a family is an important part of life, and it has a very well determined place in our lives. It helps kids see the importance of being involved in church life as a family, the importance of setting time apart to be in God's presence. Worship is about knowing and being known--knowing God and God's family, and also making friends and developing relationships in God's house.
