What Did I Do on my Sabbatical Time for Study and Renewal? First, I want you to know that it's so good to be back at First Pres. It was inspiring to read the newsletter and keep up with all that was going on while I was away. I am so impressed by all the ministry and mission that took place while I was away from the church, as well as building and equipment improvements. I didn't have any anxiety and trusted that you would all do very well during my absence. I am thankful for Dale and Bo's work, ministry, and leadership and all of the staff and session while I was gone. I am grateful to you, the church, for offering me the opportunity for study and renewal.

Ok, what was it I did during this time? We traveled to Ipswich, MA and stayed with family (free lodging)! I went over to the Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary, close by, where I received my M.Div. degree. I studied in the Library, using some of the very same desks I used back in 76-79; seems like yesterday. I remembered the times when Leslie would rescue me from the Library when we were dating. We had great seafood, as you would expect, and a special time with family. Les spent more time with family as I was at the Seminary studying. Then we returned home and I did most of my reading and studying from the house, which worked out very well.

During my sabbatical, six books (about 1700 pages) became my friend. I will share those next week. We visited our kids in Chicago at their condo several times for dinner. Finally, I had some great exercise and fun kayaking on our local rivers and small lakes.

I was able to visit 8 different churches, four in Aurora, IL, three in Joliet, IL, and one in Danvers, MA. Five of the churches are Mainline Denominations and three of the churches are nondenominational and newer churches. One church is a biker church (some motorcycles, especially the pastors) and another church is a new church start that finished its first year. All but one of the Mainline Churches had both Traditional and Contemporary worship services. I was inspired by worshipping in both Traditional and Contemporary Worship services. It was great to meet many wonderful people of faith throughout the eight churches and see what God is doing. The reason why I went to Aurora to study some of the churches there is that there are many, many churches in the immediate neighborhoods both east and west of the downtown area. They have far more churches just outside of their downtown than we do in Joliet. I wanted to see what churches were doing in some similar situations to our own congregation. I am still thinking about all that I experienced and what I can learn from the eight congregations I visited.

Once again, thank you very much for this wonderful opportunity to learn and renew my spirit. I give thanks to God for being able to worship and meet so many followers of the Lord Jesus Christ and see what God is doing in our world. In Christ, Craig
