

Sunday, December 2. We begin the Advent Season this Sunday. "Advent is not just about Christmas! Rather, it is about the beginning of the Christian year. The focus is on the future of all things as seen through the eyes of those who

follow Jesus. At the same time the Season of Advent takes history seriously and encourages us to remember and reflect upon God's mighty acts and how they affect us today." (A Guide to Prayer for All Who Walk with God, by R. Job, N. Shawchuck, J. Mogabgab) In this time we make our preparations for the Savior's birth. Come and worship and prepare to receive the Savior this Sunday.

We will celebrate the Lord's Supper at both the 9:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. worship services. We celebrate at 9:00 a.m. with the traditional elements (bread and cups) served to the congregation. At the 10:30 a.m. service we celebrate Communion by Intinction. Chancel Choir is singing at the 9:00 a.m. service. The Worship Band is singing and playing at the 10:30 a.m. service.

Sermon. This Sunday I am preaching on "God With Us: Our Potter" as we begin a new Advent Sermon Series, "God With Us." The sermon passages are Isai-ah 64:8-9 and Matthew 1:18-25. 
