Ken Myers is singing at the 9:00 a.m. service. We are going to celebrate the Lord's Supper on September 8 when we start our fall season of ministry and mission.

**SERMON,** This Sunday, Carrie Kapral is preaching on "Just as He told us" from Mark 16:1-8. Carrie writes, "I can hardly believe summer is winding down! Along with the conclusion to summer, we have reached the end of our walk through Mark's gospel. This Sunday, we will take a look at Mark 16:1-8 as the women go to Jesus' tomb to anoint Jesus' body, and discover that he is not there. Instead, the women are told, "But go, tell his disciples and Peter, 'He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you.'" (Mark 16:7). Just as he told you! Just as Jesus taught and told the disciples along the dusty roads we read about in Mark's gospel, he is teaching and telling us today. Our task is to listen and learn. I am looking forward to digging into this text with you on Sunday as we are reminded once again that Jesus has not left us alone. Peace be with you!"

*August 4th, 2019:*

### **Mark 10:35-45 (NIV) “Choose to Serve”**

Into this time of High Life Satisfaction for the Disciples, Jesus begins a three part sermon on service, sacrifice and suffering. We find 3 predictions of the going to the cross followed by the 3 failures of the Disciples to understand, and then 3 teaching sessions by Jesus. Jesus invites the Disciples and us as well, to serve, sacrifice and suffer for the Gospel.

### **Mark 11:1-11 “Palm Branches in August”**

Mark 11:1-11 is a traditional Palm Sunday text; yet even outside of Palm Sunday, this text is a powerful reminder of who Jesus is and what it means when Jesus is our Lord and Savior every day of the year. We can always shout, "Hosanna!"

### **Mark 12:28-34 “Choose Love”**

In our world, right now, we are bombarded by the cacophony of hatred. Here’s what matters. “Love your neighbor as yourself...” . The Bible says our neighbors are Other Christians, our Enemies, and Anybody in Need. What if we got rid of the illusion that there’s a “them” and acknowledge that there’s only an “Us”? What matters? Love God with your All and Love your neighbor as yourself. That’s all we need to understand to navigate life in any time.

### **“Choose to Prepare” from Mark 13:32-36, 14:12-16**

When we prepare for the way of God we align ourselves with the plan of God in the world. "In youth, because I could not be a singer, I did not even try to write a song; I set no little trees along the roadside, because I knew their growth would take so long. But now from wisdom that the years have brought me, I know that it may be a blessed thing to plant a tree for someone else to water, or make a song for someone else to sing." Speaking on his return, Jesus said, “But about that day or hour no one knows... only the Father... You do not know when that time will come” (Mark 13:32-33). When we faithfully follow him we need not be afraid.

# Children's Ministry Update

## Faith That Grows!

Today, as I sat down to write my article for the newsletter, I started thinking about all the things that happened in the past year here at First Pres. and I am sure you can agree with me that there has been a lot of change. As I was thinking about all that change I was reminded of a Bible Verse from Hebrews 13:8

***“Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.”***

I like that reminder very much, because for me it means grounding, it is a great reminder that life comes with change but at the end of the day it is faith that keeps us going and helps us stay the course.

Faith is what the church is about. Faith is what we are about at First Pres. And faith is the thing that brings us together every time when we walk in the front door. Growing in faith as a community has always been the life force of the church. Each one of us, no matter how old or young, no matter how long we have been on this faith journey, are called to come and grow in our faith. And that is the invitation I have for all of us this Fall. This is not about 'Back to Church', this is not about starting anew after the last rays of summer. This is about your faith, about igniting and stoking that fire that God has put in your heart. For kids, as always, we will have a time for music, learning and activities but also a time to run around and play, and get a blast of energy for the rest of the week.

Looking forward to seeing you in church this fall!



**Family Mid-Week's Teen Bible Study:** Family Mid-Week is beginning again on **September 18** at 5:30! This semester the teens will be taking a look at C.S. Lewis's *The Lion, The Witch, and the Wardrobe*. We will begin the study by watching the film on September 18. We normally eat with our church family on Wednesday nights, but due to the run time of the film we will be grabbing a plate and heading to the teen lounge for a viewing party! Why *The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe*? C.S. Lewis had written *The Chronicles of Narnia* as a way to bring faith to life for young people. The story is filled with temptation, redemption, and a beautiful sacrifice. Reading the book isn't required—we'll be reading sections of text together and looking at how the story mirrors humanity's journey with Christ.



**Confirmation:** On September 8th at 4:30pm we will begin the 2019/2020 confirmation journey! Students in 8th or 9th grade are invited to join us! A schedule will be handed out on September 8 so parents and students can keep an eye out for a few days we don't meet (Thanksgiving and Christmas breaks). Students will be welcomed to the class on the 8th where we will make up a name to call ourselves, go over what Confirmation is, and talk about a confirmation sponsor: Who can it be? What is expected? Confirmation is a great opportunity for students to dig into their faith, ask those tough questions, and receive a little more individualized attention. It's going to be a fantastic year!

**Wildfire Youth Group:** Beginning on September 8th at 6:00pm we will have a Youth Group launch party! We will go over required forms, a code of conduct, and end with a competitive water balloon toss! Guardians/Parents are required to attend this first meeting. The winner of the balloon toss will receive a \$25 gift card to Cinemark, which if used on Tuesday will pay for a family of four to go so a show in Joliet! This year in youth group we will be learning about the Holy Spirit. Students will be provided with a journal and questions that help them dig deeper.
