



"The Gospel of Mark" Summer Sermon Series

Our journey, this Summer, through the Gospel of Mark is nearly over. We started on June 2 and will finish up on September 1. It's will end up being a 14-week study of the Gospel of Mark. I encourage you to read from the Gospel of Mark each week, the shortest Gospel, in preparation for our Sermon Study. In these final two weeks we are choosing texts from two chapters.

September 1 Mark 15-16

I am preaching this Sunday on "Choose to Prepare" from Mark 13:32-36; 14:12-16. Here Jesus advises being prepared for when he returns. Being prepared is far better than acting as though he will never return or doing nothing. I think of the following: "In youth, because I could not be a singer, I did not even try to write a song; I set no trees along the roadside, because I knew their growth would take so long..." Instead of living that way we can anticipate, watch, be alert, and be prepared. Come worship and think about Jesus asking us to choose preparation in our lives.

#### Sunday, August 18- "Choose to Love" from Mark 12:28-34

Life moves very fast. The schools and colleges are open again and kids are going back to school. Moms and Dads are scrambling... Retirees tell me they are busier now than when they were working.

In our world, right now, we are bombarded by the cacophony of hatred from the (in alphabetical order) far left and far right, etc. We are told that it's wrong to be in the center and to work together with those people; that's too bad; a house divided is not good. It's such a noisy time in our world and life is rushing by so quickly. The pace and problems can wear us out.

What really matters and how do we know? What takes priority in all of the noise? Jesus speaks into that. It's a high-pressure time for Jesus; every moment matters.

It's two days after Palm Sunday, the last week of Jesus' life. No by now, it's the final 4 days; three days later Jesus is crucified.

In Mark 12 Jesus is being pursued by religious leaders who want more than anything to destroy him. With time moving at a frantic pace; 3.5 days from that dark Friday crucifixion, Jesus answers. Here's what matters.

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength."

And second, "Love your neighbor as your-self..."

'And who is our neighbor?' we might ask. The Bible says Other Christians, our Enemies, and Anybody in Need. The temptation is to say be like us, be like me, and I will love you, when church is all about being like Jesus. What if we obliterated once and for all the illusion that there's a "them" and acknowledge that there's only an "Us"? (Father Greg Boyles).

What matters? Relationships, Jesus says. Love God with your All and Love your neighbor as yourself. That's all we need to understand to navigate life in any time.


The 2019 Annual Church Picnic will be this Sunday, August 25th!
