I encourage you to start reading the Gospel of Mark, the shortest Gospel, in preparation for our Sermon Study and throughout the summer. Most weeks you can read one chapter and come prepared for the Sunday morning Sermon and worship.

August 11: "Palm Branches in August" Mark 11:1-11

August 18: "Choose to Love" Mark 12:28-34

August 25: "Choose to Prepare"

Mark 13:32-36; 14:12-16

This Sunday, for "Palm Branches in August," Carrie writes the following.

"We are far from Palm Sunday. It is either in the past, or in the future, depending on whether we look back at 2019 or ahead to 2020. We are in the midst of ordinary time on the church calendar - a time when there are no "special" times — no Palm Sunday or Easter; no Christ the King Sunday, no advent, no Christmas. Just regular, ordinary time. Mark 11:1-11 is a traditional Palm Sunday text — how do we read these verses in August? Are there palm branches in August? This passage is rich with reminders of who Jesus is and what it means when Jesus is our Lord and Savior every day of the year. We can always shout "Hosanna!" Palm branches in August? Absolutely."

Sunday, August 4 "Choose to Serve" Mark 10:35-45 (NIV)

Into this time of High Life Satisfaction for the Disciples, Jesus begins a three part sermon on service, sacrifice and suffering. We see the repetition of these themes in chapters 8, 9 and 10 of Mark. We find 3 predictions of the going to the cross followed by the 3 failures of the Disciples to understand, and then 3 teaching sessions by Jesus. This passage, Mark 10:35-45 is the third teaching session by Jesus. Jesus invites the Disciples and us as well, to serve, sacrifice and suffer for the Gospel, saying, "

For even the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve but to give his life as a ransom for many." (Mark 10:45).

I think of Amy Carmichael's poem,
"Hast thou no scar?
No hidden scar on foot, or side, or hand?
I hear thee sung as mighty in the land,
I hear them hail thy bright ascendant star:

Hast thou no scar? Hast thou no wound? No wound? No scar?

Yes, as the master shall the servant be, And pierced are the feet that follow Me; But thine are whole. Can one have followed far Who has no wound? No scar? "




Mark Your Galendars
