Sunday, September 29- "More Mercy" Matthew 9:9-13, Jeremiah 22:13-17, Micah 6:6-8

Look out across the world today and throughout our society, and you see too much hostility and too much hatred. There's a disdain for others, and an inability to civilly disagree. There's a disconnect in understanding and an alarming inattention to our common humanity. We could use some More Mercy and some More Justice.

Jesus comes saying, "But go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, not 'sacrifice.' For I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners." (Matthew 9:13)

Jesus in his ministry is Lavish and Extravagant in loving people. Jesus is sensitive to suffering, an indignation for injustice.

Napoleon once said: "Charlemagne, Caesar, Alexander, and myself have conquered great empires by force. Jesus of Nazareth by love. And countless 1000's willingly follow him."

The women of First Pres are studying *Messy People: Life Lessons from Imperfect Biblical Heroes* a Bible Study by Jennifer Cowart. " Every life gets messy at times. Sometimes these messes are literal, but sometimes they are intangible messes." "In this six-week study, Jennifer Cowart helps us dig into the lives of biblical heroes who were messy people just like us but who were used by God in powerful ways."



The men of First Pres are studying *Making Sense of the Bible* by Adam Hamilton. This book addresses the big topics that are attached to the church, and answers questions asked by people both Christian and not. In a relatable and inviting way this book discusses often misunderstood themes of the Bible and leads readers to a personal and deeper understanding and appreciation of the word of God. Expect to consider, discuss, and learn about questions such as:

Did Jesus really teach that everyone who is not a Christian will be assigned to hell? Why would Paul command women to "keep silent in the church?" Is the book of Revelation really about the end times? Who decided which books made it into the scriptures and why? Is the Bible ever wrong?



Tonight's lesson gets into the nitty gritty details of the Land of Narnia. This week will explore the sacrifice of Aslan that mirrors the sacrifice of Christ. This week's study is called "It will be harder than you think" and talks about how we, as humans, often take for granted (or don't even realize) the true sacrifice that was made in order for us to be brought back together with Jesus. Each lesson is finished with watching parts of the film!



Children ages 3 to 5th grade are having weekly lessons and related activities while their parents enjoy their own studies! We will be doing fun holiday crafts, and teaching kids the importance of faith, fellowship, and study in their lives. Autumn is quickly approaching, and soon the weather will become cooler and the leaves will change. Over the next few weeks we will be following a series called *Autumn Leaves*, as we learn that God makes all things beautiful, as the changing leaves remind us of. So far we have learned to be cautious in life, to remember that God has a plan, and not to idolize material things such as phones or tv or clothes.
