Following Jesus isn't a narrow thing, something limited to Sunday morning worship. A life of discipleship is vast, wide and sacrificial, to use just a few adjectives. Luke 10:25-37 tells the story we know as "The Good Samaritan". It is a love-as-a-verb story. It's a story of acting, of doing, of caring. It's a story about being active in the lives of others, about loving our neighbor. Jesus ends the story in Luke 10:37 by saying "Go and do likewise." Maybe you have read this passage many times; or perhaps it will be the first time you've heard it. Either way, it's a reminder to us to extend ourselves in loving and serving others. It is a challenge to figure out what each of us, using our unique gifts and talents, are called to do. It's a call for each of us to go and do likewise.

Sunday, November 3- "Encouragers Go Further" Romans 12:6-8, 15:4-7

We have different gifts, if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; Some people are especially gifted that way, no doubt about that. Yet, on the other hand, our world needs more encouragers. We'll see that encouragement is used in the scriptures that suggest that all of us should make encouragement a part of our practice.
