Sunday, December 8- "Watch In Hope" Luke 1:46-56, Psalm 107:1-9

There are times in life when we find ourselves on watch. We watch for the first signs of getting better after an illness or surgery. We watch for the beginning sights of a Sunrise. We watch and anticipate the Wonder of a night time sky. When kayaking, I watch for large rocks in the cascading waters of the rapids as I paddle through surging and splashing waters.
