Sunday, February 9 "Foundations for Making a New Life" Daniel 1, Luke 8:22-25

How to you live in times of crisis, great change, a new culture, laws, and religions?

What do you do? How to you adapt? How do you remain true to the Lord God? In one way you live how you always lived; with faith in the Lord your God.

In another way you live as you have never lived before in a strange and different place.

You must now learn to get a double education. You need to understand the new culture and wisdom of the day; the era. Yet you must keep your faith and look for points of contact, commonality between the Lord God and your new circumstances...

And you now must decide what your line in sand is going to be and hold fast to your faith, perhaps even unto death.

As we look at Daniel we find that Living in faith requires: a **Reliance** upon the Lord.

a Resistance to what is not faith,

a **Resolve** to do what is right, good, and true (bravery). building **Relationships**- making new relationships and keeping old ones.

Daniel **relies** on God and resists what is not congruent with faithfulness to God.

He would not eat the royal food; it would have been consecrated by heathen religious rites; prayed over in honor of the gods of Babylon.

So, for Daniel to eat this food would be to give himself to idol-worship.

It would signify that he was trusting in false gods, willing to worship them, that he was willing to derive his sustenance from gods that were not gods.

This was a line he would not cross and was willing to die for. He **resists**.

He **resolves** to worship and live for the Lord even if they take his life.

Yet he **builds relationships** not only with people of faith but also with

Babylonians people, advisors, and kings. Daniel shows us how to live in our post Christian era and society.
