Easter Sunday, April 12, 2020 "God's Will and the New Creation" Mark 16:1-8

Turn to the New Testament and you find that Good Friday was a gigantic

black out, shut-down experience for the first disciples.

The crucifixion of Jesus blacked out, completely stopped, and slammed the hopes, dreams, and energy of the disciples.

Ministry was over, dead and buried.

They wondered, would this storm consume them too?

The disciples are scattered, their hopes shattered, their souls are shaken.

The women, were the first to venture out. They went to the tomb, with their spices, as was their custom.

The Sabbath was over with its agonized forced inactivity since the crucifixion and burial of Jesus.

Now at last, the women could do something, even if it was only caring for the dead.

Early before full daylight, they were expressing their love and deep devotion, but it was only the adoration of a dead Jesus.

Like the disciples, for all their closeness to Jesus they had not fully understood him.

Who will roll the stone away for us, they wondered out loud.

The stone was easily rolled into place, as the track for the stone was inclined downward, to prevent it's reopening.

A young man in white, turns out to be an angel, begins the process of turning back on the light of hope for the followers of Jesus.

They are alarmed in the sense that they are terribly afraid.

The first result of resurrection is fear. It means a venturing out into the continually new and unknown.

They did not want to lose their earthly Jesus; yet transforming their faith to connect with the

Risen Lord was necessary.

They are stunned and afraid.

Thus, the young man in white says, Don't be afraid.

Now, they are urged to face the hard facts of life, with faith rather than fear.

God has already done what they could not themselves do, remove the stone of death.

Jesus has risen, life is changed.
