Sunday 10th—"Comfort in Community" Romans 12:4-5,9-15

I am preaching this Sunday on "Life on Pause." The scripture passages for the sermon and worship service are: Psalm 46, Philippians 4:6-8, and Luke 4:42-44.

I encourage you to read the passages before you worship this Sunday or Saturday evening. Our Shelter in Place Order is continuing another month, even though there are a few changes. After almost six weeks we have four more weeks to go. Our lives seem like they are, in many ways, on extended pause from being with other people. If you are working remotely or going into the office and doing many things differently then you may have the sense you are going through a very hectic time. You may be looking for a pause from all of that. This Sunday we will think about our lives on extended pause, whatever that may look like at this time.
