We will consider how life in Jesus is far more rewarding, challenging, and meaningful than the poverty of alternatives we see in our world today.

This is a challenging time with the coronavirus pandemic and the loss of life we are seeing and all of the restrictions we are undergoing to keep everyone safe. Please keep lifting up prayers for healing, vaccines and medicines. Around the world, there is a very high infection rate amongst the poorest areas such as the congested slums of Sao Paulo, Brazil and Mumbai, India (25%), and Mathare Valley, Kenya. The workers lose their jobs and cannot buy food because employers are afraid of the spread of the coronavirus. Say some special prayers for desperate poor in our world.

Sunday, May 17- "A Wider View" Acts 1:4-8, Ephesians 3:14-21 (NIV)

What if we had a wider view of life? What if we could see and process life through the wide angled lens of Jesus? Jesus calls us to develop a wider perspective in life as we see our world.

When we do this, we look through the wide-angle lens of Jesus love. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love,

18 may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ.

high and deep is the love of Christ,

19 and to know this love that surpasses
knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of
all the fullness of God.

The great prayer is that we grasp, understand the expansive love of Christ. For then we will have wide, expansive love for others in the world. But we can't stop there and use only the wide angled lens. Having seen and experienced the wide expansive love of Jesus we must love. Once we have grasped something of the wide grandeur of Christ's love we must expend that love somewhere, in some place, to someone.

Stay only with wide angle lens and life gets distorted We can't just see from far away; stand back, observe, and be uninvolved.

Thus, Jesus used a regular lens and a telephoto lens as he spoke into the lives of his disciples saying. You will be my witnesses not just to the ends of the earth;

You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, And our mission statement says, that we are called to be Servants of Jesus Christ. to minister to one another, our community (not just the world). Jesus wants us to get close to those who are hurting and in need.

Jesus wants his followers to realize that there are people close by who need to experience the practical rescuing love of God.

There is the need is for us to move to a regular lens and to a telephoto lens to zoom in. We must get up close to real people.

Then as Jesus hands over his ministry, mission to the disciples,

in beginning of the book of Acts, he says you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." The entire book of Acts is based on that outline...

All the lens of love are in play: regular, telephoto, and wide.
