The book of Ephesians, written to a group of churches, expresses the width and breadth and length of God's love and grace. It describes the importance of the Church and why the Body of Christ exists and how it services and does ministry in the world. Paul indicates how the Church crosses racial boundaries and social classes for all are one in Christ Jesus. There's even more to this wonderful book and letter of the Apostle Paul. Sunday, June 21, "Pandemic, Protest, and Prayer" Ephesians 1:15-20

I believe I can safely say that 2020 has, at least so far, been unique. Lots of hard things to deal with (I'm not going to list them, we each have our own catalog of events in our head.) Yet, in some ways, we can see 2020 in the pages of Scripture. Sometimes when we read those ancient words, it almost, almost, seems as if we are looking in a mirror. God's Word, after all, is timeless. That's how I feel when I read Paul's words in his letter to the Ephesians (2:15-20). Paul, as he so often does, reminds us of who we are -- as individuals in Christ, and as a family of believers. As such, we are called to prayer. Even now. Even when it feels like nothing will ever be "normal" again. Even when our hearts ache because we want to know what to do and how to help. When we read Paul's words we see a man giving thanks to God. He doesn't give thanks for a house, for friends, for family, or for anything tangible; although when we have those things we should be thankful. Who we see is a man giving thanks for faith in Jesus, for love toward fellow Christians, for a spirit of wisdom. Paul prays for unseen, eternal things and for invisible, essential things.

I'm excited to take a deep dive into these six verses because they remind me that even in the midst of pandemics and protests, there is ALWAYS prayer and because there is always prayer, there is always HOPE. God bless you - I will see you Sunday!

Sunday, June 14- "What Do We Think About God?" Ephesians 1:3-14, Psalm 145

We have places within our lives that we can access. We have places of hope, trust, and faith inside of us, but we have other places as well—places with names like anxiety, discouragement, anger, and fear. We can choose to lead and live from any one of those places. But sometimes we choose to live in that place called fear. That's understandable, for we live in a profoundly disruptive and disorienting age.

We stand on ground that is riddled with the fault lines of fear, and sometimes we move toward others from a place of anxiety instead of faith.

So, what are the fault lines of fear that run through your life?

What does fear look like for you?...
We can all live in that place named fear. But today
we are going to focus, not on our fears, but on hope
and faith. We can stand on the ground that is stable
with the strength of faith. We can move toward others from a place of promise instead of anxiety and
fear

"Faith is about standing on firm ground that is not riddled with the fault lines of fear," writes Parker Palmer.

What does it mean to stand on the firm ground of Essential faith, and the Extraordinary Grace of God? That's what the book of Ephesians is about and more. Let's take a long, long, look at God and a much shorter glance at your fears.

What do we think of God? What is it that God has in

What do we think of God? What is it that God has in mind for us?

These verses from vs. 3 to vs. 14 are actually, in the Greek, one sentence. And this one sentence written to a group of Churches in Ephesus is packed with hope, trust, and faith; about who God is, what God does.

First of all we find out that we were in God's mind. God was thinking about us long ago.

Before we were around God was thinking about us.

We matter to God. We were/are in God's mind. You mattered to God even before God was on your mind.
