

Sunday, July 5- "Hostility Down, Reconciliation Up" Ephesians 2:11-22 (NIV)

Let Freedom Ring, Let Freedom Ring, we sing and say on the 4th of July weekend. We have much to do to Let Freedom Ring in the American experiment and experience.

There's a lot of hostility and barriers in our land and they're nothing new; they're ancient.

There was a barrier between Jews and Gentiles; Israel and other nations.

"Israel's identity was rooted in being God's holy people; they understood that they were different. Their only king was God. The Gentiles might be ruled over by kings and tyrants and rulers the king of Israel was God. To be an Israelite was to be a member of the society of God. It was to have a citizenship which was divine.

The Israelites believed that God approached their nation with a special offer. I will take you to me for a people, and I will be to you a God. This relationship involved not only privilege, it also involved obligation.

God's choice of Israel was a choice for special responsibility."¹

The Gentiles, however, were strangers from covenants with God. The Greeks wrote much about wisdom yet if you read through their writings there is a strong note of despair. This essential despair had to do with the belief that this life was all there was for the most part. You lived and died and that was it. The god's if they existed were capricious, certainly not on your side. They had much in common with the Rabbi in Fiddler on the Roof- Rabbi was asked if there was a prayer for the Czar.

Yes, "Lord keep the Czar very far away from us"

So, it was with the Greeks. Keep the gods far away from us. Jews hated and despised the Gentile. Now in Christ, Paul indicates that this hatred comes to an end because a new unity, possibility, has come.

Those who were far away have been brought near in Christ Jesus. Jesus, who is our peace, has destroyed the dividing wall of hostility, and made the two groups one.

The dividing wall was the wall in the Temple that separated the back area of the temple, the Court of the Gentiles from the rest of the Temple. Any Gentile who passed beyond that wall would immediately be put to death. Now the wall comes down in Jesus; Let Freedom Ring- Jew and Gentile are one in Christ.
