"The Pull of the World and the Way of Christ" Ephesians 4:17-32 (NIV)

This Passage is about Before and After and Now. Here's the **before**.

Paul writes, (21-22) You were taught, with regard to your former way of life, to put off your old self, which is being corrupted by its deceitful desires;

Put off the old self, the old way of living before you knew Christ.

Here's the after.

(24) and you were taught to put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness. Put on the new self after you came to know Christ Jesus.

It's interesting to note that the before and the after are in the past, one point in time. There was a time before you were a follower of Jesus, so you lived a life that fell short of the hope, joy, and strength that is in Christ.

Then there came a time after you knew Christ when you began to live in the way, the school, the manner of Jesus. You put on the very life of Christ.

Here's the **now**. Living in the now for which most of the passage is about. It's sandwiched in between the before and the after, the old self and new self.

You were taught, to be made new in the attitude of your minds.

It is significant that "to be made new" is in the present tense. It indicates the need for ongoing, continual renewal.

Once you can say after I knew Jesus, there is the challenge to continue to live into the newness of Christ.

There is the need to strive to develop the fullness of life in Jesus.

This is an ongoing process, as we never arrive,... we strive to put on more and more of Christ.

Now is a time to consciously life the Christian life. Before I knew Jesus, I lived a different life.

After I knew Jesus, I began to live for him.

Now I must continue to connect with the way of Jesus, why?

Because the pull of the world, the society, the culture of the day is not for life of faith.

Paul in his letter to the Ephesian Churches wants to be clear about what life in Jesus looks like compared to life in the Greco-Roman culture of the day.

There's a difference.

And it's surprising how tough Paul is in describing the culture of the day.

It's remarkable because he is sent to win Gentiles to faith

You might think he'd start with a point of commonality.

Instead he paints a stark contrast between the culture and life in Christ.
