The Most Amazing View Timothy 1:12-20 (NIV)

I have wall art in my home that says, "May your trails be crooked and winding, leading to the most amazing view." The most amazing view. My trails have, indeed, been crooked and winding – hopefully less so the more I am able to focus on the MOST amazing view, Jesus.

Jesus is amazing. And so much more! The apostle Paul knew this. His trail had been crooked and winding. Paul the apostle is a person worth listening to and learning from because he lived his life for Christ. Yet, he started out as Saul, who was a blasphemer, a persecutor, a violent man. These traits are not what comes to mind when we describe a faithful follower of Christ. That's the point! Paul says that he was shown mercy because he acted in ignorance and unbelief. Haven't we all, at some point, acted the same? Probably not in the same way as Saul/Paul, but in so many other ways? And yet, there is mercy. Because Jesus came into the world to save sinners. He heaped mercy on us. As a result, we have access to the most amazing view – the love and mercy of Jesus.

It's been a rough year, no doubt about it. Years like this can blur the view, years like this can tempt us to wander back onto some of those crooked and winding paths. It's okay – the view is still there. We just need to turn our faces toward it. This is one of the reasons the church is so important, we are stronger together. We can remind one another who we are in Christ. Not with judgment, or anger, or frustration, but with mercy and faith and love.

May you feel the peace of Christ this week, no matter where your path is leading you.

We will have time to talk about these things as the months unfold. I thank you for being able to serve as your pastor these many years.

Sunday, September 13, "Advance" I Timothy 1:1-11, Mark 12:28-34 (NIV)

What a fall season this is for starting school. School's on again, off again, on, off... They were going to have both in class and remote learning, a hybrid model. But many colleges had tough starts with coronavirus outbreaks.

Grade school and High school systems were watching. Finally, many decided to wait, going back to the classrooms for half a week. Therefore, many kids are home with remote schooling again.

Crystal Lowery was talking about how remote schooling was going at her house this fall because of Covid-19.

"My 2nd grader has 5 video meetings per day. Five zoom meetings. At one point he goes,

'I think this one could have been an e-mail." So, I guess he's ready for the Corporate World. "

Just when we thought things were getting much, much better we had an increase in Covid-19 cases and many plans changed. Problems happen in our world.

That's a dynamic we see in the Ephesian Church as we dig into our study of I Timothy. There were problems arising in the Ephesian Church. Until then, the church had been flourishing. Paul had made it a center for evangelism for three years.

The church was growing and very viable. Their mission was to advance God's work, the good news of the Gospel for new life, salvation, by faith in Jesus Christ.

Then all of a sudden, unexpectedly, problems started to surface. We don't hear about them in the book of Ephesians but we do in I Timothy. But now some 3 to 5 years later in the Ephesian Church we learn about the challenges, the impediments, the obstacles that surfaced.

Right in the first chapter, in the opening 5 out of 7 verses, we find out what is going south.

Paul is out of prison and has gone to northern Greece on a mission.

He wants Timothy to stay in Ephesus to guide and lead the church, and solve problems.

Here are the problems that are disrupting the vitality and life in the Ephesian Church.

There were false teachers, teaching false doctrines, beliefs about the faith.

They were spinning out myths, stories of genealogies and promoting controversial speculations and meaningless talk.

They want to be teachers but don't know what they are talking about even though they are so confident.

Doesn't that sound like today with all of our social media, blogs, podcasts, etc.
