



Advent Sermon Series "The Wonder of Christmas"

During the Advent Season we are going to explore the Wonder of Christmas once more.

It's still possible to pause and sense the Wonder of the surpassing gift of Jesus Christ, our Savior. In this Advent Season we will seek to experience once again the awe, the wonderment, and the surprising grace of the Lord Jesus. Over four Sundays and Christmas Eve we will think about the Wonder of Hope, Faith, Love, Peace, and Joy.

Sunday, November 29, "The Wonder of Hope" Psalm 80:1-7, 17-19

I work in downtown Joliet, in an office with no windows. So I like to slip outside, feel the sun and get some fresh air once in a while. A few weeks ago, I met a friend by the fountain across the street from the Rialto. And I noticed something odd. I saw various winter coats wrapped around trees. I asked my friend why and she said people leave coats on the trees so that those who are without a coat can take one and be warm. How WONDERFUL this is! It reminded me that hope is ALWAYS present, because hope is grounded in God and his promises. Hope is more than wishes, hope is a sure thing. A sure thing like God working through regular ordinary people to bring warmth to others.

We are entering into Advent, an Advent like none before it. Shopping still needs to be done. Christmas and Thanksgiving, need to be figured out. How do we celebrate safely? It's a whole new level to the chaos that the Christmas season typically brings. But Advent is a time of waiting. Not just to open presents, but to celebrate the birth of Jesus. Advent reminds us that God does not want to be distant, that he actually entered right into the midst of this busy, messy, loud chaotic world

This Sunday we will be taking a look at parts of Psalm 80. Psalm 80 is actually a corporate prayer of lament. A catastrophe has befallen the community and the people cry out to God. Just as we do today. God has not abandoned us. He brings the good news of mercy, love and HOPE in person through Jesus Christ, born in the most humble of circumstances long ago.

Psalm 80 is a lament, and a beacon of hope. The people cried out to God to be saved. And he saves us. Unexpectedly. Powerfully. Hope comes into our world as a defenseless baby. The psalmist demanded that God's face shine, and shine it did - in the light of a child born in Bethlehem. The light that darkness has not, and will not, overcome.
