Sunday December 27th "He Promises" John 1:1-14

After a year such as 2020, it's easy to ask ourselves questions such as:

Where is God?

How does he work in the world?

How do we know he is working in the world?

We find the answers to our questions in Scripture passages like John 1:1-14. This is a great passage to reflect upon as we enter a new year and face the continued uncertainty around us.

We read in the Bible that God is present and active in the world he created through the people he created. He worked first through Adam and Eve as they tended the garden; he worked through Sarah and Abraham to give birth to the Jewish nation. God chose to work through Moses to set his people in Egypt free from slavery - and he worked through King David to establish Israel.

We may be so familiar with these stories that we lose track of the miracle of them! And then, speaking of stunning, magnificent, wonderful miracles -- God chose to work through a young woman named Mary, who gave birth to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. God came and LIVED HERE AMONG US.

This is what tells us God is actively engaged in the world through human beings. Jesus grew up and when he began his public ministry the first thing he did was gather a group of disciples to help carry out his mission. Could God have carried out his mission without the help of people? I would say of course and yet that is not what he did. He invited us into his work and ministry.

The reality is that God very likely works through people far more often than we realize. God has been with us in 2020, and he will be with us in 2021. He has promised that, and we can trust his promises.

One last thing - if you are looking for a memory verse for the new year, I suggest John 1:14. "The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth."
