# Sunday, December 6 "The Wonder of Faith" Luke1:26-38, 45-55

Over this Advent Season I invite you to Wonder once more, to enter into the Wonder of Hope, Faith, Love, Peace, and Joy come to us in the Savior, Christ Jesus.

Can you remember the last time you gazed at life with Wonder? the Wonder of feeling better after an illness or surgery, the Wonder of a night time sky or reflecting upon a fresh Sunrise, or what about the Wonder of the first new fallen snow, or seeing the first lights of the Christmas Season, or holding a newborn baby?

Come, this season and experience the Wonder of the reality of hope, Faith and God's love, peace and joy. I experience the Wonder of Faith in Mary's response to God.

In Luke's Gospel, Chapter 1, we step back before that first Christmas morning. We step all the way back to when Mary first heard the news of Jesus birth, first learned that she would have a child. When the Angel appeared Mary, certainly knew far less about Jesus and all that his birth would mean, than on that day when he was born, that first Christmas morn.

Here's her first glimpse into the plans of God. Imagine what she must have felt, and thought. Never forget that we are looking back at a decisive moment in time.

Remember, that Jesus was Mary's son as well as God's...which a lot of people tend to forget at times. Jesus was Mary's son too.

Notice, mark it down, that it took a yes from Mary before God could send forth his Son, Jesus. Mary can hardly, at first, believe what she's hearing from the Angel.

You are going to have a baby. No way, I don't have a husband.

It's not a done deal just because the Angel Gabriel shows up.

And all of a sudden, what happens...Mary says ok, yes, Mary gives an unqualified yes.

Here am I, the servant of the Lord, let it be with me according to your word.

Yes, I will serve; I will accept my assignment. And of course she cannot know all that her yes will mean.

Yet, I wonder at such faith.
