### Sunday, February 7 "Hope: Beyond Wishful Thinking" Psalm 130, I Peter 1:3-9

We have places within our lives that we can access. We have places of hope, trust, and faith inside of us, but we have other places as well—

places with names like anxiety, discouragement, and fear.

We can choose to lead and live from any one of those places. But sometimes we choose to live in that place called fear.

That's understandable, for we live in a profoundly disruptive and disorienting age.

We stand on ground that is riddled with the fault lines of fear, and move toward others from a place of anxiety instead of hope.

So, what are the fault lines of fear that run through your life?

What does fear look like for you?

We can live in that place named fear.

But today we are going to focus, not on our fears, but on hope.

We can stand on the ground that is stable with the strength of hope.

We move toward others from a place of promise instead of anxiety and fear.

"Hope is about standing on firm ground that is not riddled with the fault lines of fear," writes Parker Palmer.

What does it mean to stand on the firm ground of hope, to choose hope?

Hope is an integral part of our living and not reserved just for dying, the next life. Hope is more than optimism, it allows us to dream, to move forward but not as grinning hapless fools unaware of the risks inherent to everyday life.

Hope does not encourage us to ignore reality.

Ultimately hope is grounded in the experience of Resurrection and in the presence of the risen Lord in the ongoing life of the church.

We face life with the living hope of Jesus Christ within us.

"In his great mercy God has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,..."

Jesus was crucified, dead, buried, but he resurrected and lives again.

That changes everything.

Dead things come back to life.

The Resurrection of Jesus is our foundation for hope.

Christ Jesus is our hope. (I Tim. 1:1).

Christ in us is the hope of glory. (Colossians

1:27)
