Last Sundays Sermon- "Seek Life" Series

Sunday, February 14 "Reflection: Providence Favors the Prepared Mind" Romans 12:1-2 (NIV & Message Bible), Matthew 5:13-16, Mark 12:28-31

Today, I invite you to think with me about reflection, the nuances of reflection, the different sides to reflection, the beauty of reflection.

Probably one of the first reflections that we see each morning is ourselves in the mirror.

Now before you say ouch, not good. I want you to think of the beauty of seeing, a person made in the image of God, a human being lovingly and carefully created, gifted by God, loved by the Lord Jesus Christ, ransomed with a redemptive potential in mind, made for a meaningful purpose.

Think about that beauty before you see bed head, the sleep that needs combed away, washed away, make-uped away. Yes, some mornings like you I don't much see the beauty; for some mornings I hear the voice of comedian Dana Carvey speaking to mescary, scary, it's scary.

Yet there is a beauty in seeing the reflection of a human being created, loved, sustained by God.

How about the beauty of seeing yourself in a reflection of the Chicago skyline, in the sculpture nicknamed The Bean. How about seeing the reflection of the mountains on the beautiful Glacier Lake?

Just as sure as the Millennium Bean and Glacier Lake have a reflection so do you and I have a reflection. But, beyond that simple reflection in the mirror, that surface reality; I am thinking in a bigger sense,

What is the reflection of our life?

What do others see in our reflection? What do we reflect to other people?

Do we reflect the love, joy, determination, and redemptive hope of Jesus Christ? Or do we reflect anger, discouragement, despair, and selfishness?Does our reflection depend on the changing realities of the day?

One day we're up, full of love, energy, and hope,... and another day we're in a different place...

I believe that we reflect what we reflect upon. We mirror back what we allow to shine into our life.

What captures our attention, interest, passion, energy, and imagination is what we reflect. We reflect what we put into our mind.

As we think so we are.

As we think so we feel.

As we think so we see.

As we think so we act.

That's why Paul writes, "Be transformed by the renewing of your mind.

Don't become so well adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead fix your attention on God."

Become transformed by the renewal of your mind. This is learning to look at life on the basis of God's view of reality.

It's developing a spiritual sensitivity and perception to the mind of Christ.
