## "Team Jesus: Who are You in the Church?" Sermon Series

In this series we will think about all of the various kinds of people we need to be the church today. We need those who depend upon the Good Shepherd. We need people who will provide resources, act on their faith, and show appreciation. The church needs servants who will stand with those in need no matter how difficult the situation. We need members who will teach and mentor others, and more. During the Lenten Season as we anticipate Easter, we will look at those who followed Jesus in the New Testament and see what we can learn about ourselves and about the Church of Jesus Christ.

## Maundy Thursday, April 1 "A Lesson about Mission on God's Grace: Judas"

#### Matthew 26:14-30, Exodus 12:1-14

"On Maundy Thursday the church remembers the last evening Jesus shared with his disciples in the upper room before his arrest and crucifixion. Maundy Thursday marks three key events in Jesus' last week: his washing of his disciples' feet, his institution of the Lord's Supper, and his new commandment to love one another. This service begins the

Triduum, the three-day period from sunset on Thursday to sunset on Easter Day. The name "Maundy Thursday" comes from the Latin man datum novum, referring to the "new commandment" Jesus taught his disciples (John 13:34). In other words, this is "new commandment Thursday."

As we look at this new commandment that Jesus has for his disciples, we have to confront Judas and his decisions. As we read Matthew 26:14-30, let us remember that the Last Supper is a place of grace, a place of love and each and everyone of the disciples are welcomed by their teacher. As we look at Judas - A story of missing God's grace, I would invite you to think about Judas as one of the people that followed Jesus, of all the things he got to experience what might of lead him to the decision he made. At the end of the day Judas' story is still a story of grace and of unrealized potential. Let us look with hope in your heart, toward the last supper, toward the cross and let us invite our teacher, our Lord to come and dwell once again in our midst.

Easter Sunday, March 28 "Someone who Stands With Us: Mary, John, and Jesus" Matthew 28:1-10; I Corinthians 15:3-8, John 19:25-27

# Last Sundays Sermon-"Team Jesus: Who are You in the Church?" Sermon Series "Someone who Shows Appreciation: the Leper and the Crowd" Mark 11:1-11, Luke 17:11-19

Only one of the ten lepers returns to give thanks to God and to Jesus for his healing. This story points out the ingratitude of nine lepers. However, we see the gratitude of the one leper highlighted for us. Jesus accepts the thanksgiving, praise and gratitude of the leper who returned. Thus, this story can teach us about showing appreciation to God and to others.

On that first Palm Sunday we see Jesus accepting the gratitude, adoration, and worship of the crowds who cheered him with their Hosannas.

This sermon focuses on the importance and significance of celebrating who God is and being grateful to others in our lives. Only everyone needs to receive genuine appreciation and love. How sad it is to see so much contentiousness, hatred, and demonization for other people in our society today. We can be encouraged and learn from the appreciation of Jesus in both the Palm Sunday Story and the Leper Story we find in the Gospels.
