### Sunday, April 18 "Someone who Mentors: the Centurion"

Everyone needs a Yoda- a mentor, a coach, or a teacher along the way,

If we are to live a complete and faithful life, to which Christ calls us, we need mentors.

I invite you think with me today about the mentors in your life.

Each one of us needs someone to look up to, someone wiser,

someone who inspires us in the faith, someone more experienced than us, someone who displays skills for life and faithfulness to Jesus.

Isaac Newton once said,

"If I have seen further, it is by standing on the shoulders of giants."

Whose shoulders are we standing on? Who do we look up to?

Who do we see and say, I want to be like them some day?

The greatest example of mentoring in history is that of Jesus with the disciples.

In the scriptures there's Elizabeth and Mary, Elijah and Elisha, and Moses and Joshua, we read of this morning.

God says to Joshua, "Be strong and very courageous.

Be careful to obey all the law my servant Moses gave you; do not turn from it to the right or to the left, that you may be successful wherever you go.

The Roman Centurion is a mentor figure for us, I believe.

For Jesus said of him,

"I tell you, I have not found such great faith even in Israel."

We learn a number of things about this Centurion from our text.

The Centurion is a mentor for us because we can see and learn from his compassion, genuine worship of God, humility, and extraordinary faith in Jesus.
