#### Sunday, April 25 "Thankful and Grateful People: Craig and Paul"

The Philippian Church was, perhaps, Paul's favorite church. He wrote to them,

I thank my God every time I remember you. <sup>4</sup> In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy... <sup>7</sup> It is right for me to feel this way about all of you, since I hold you in my heart...,

My wish for every Pastor and every follower of Jesus, is that they could speak of a favorite church and give thanks for that people of faith.

But not everyone can do that. I think of a Pastor who retired at a church, in a suburb, north of here. He called his last month at the church, a "Cantankerous Finality." They were known for being a contentious church and especially tough to their pastors. How sad.

I am so thankful and grateful for being able to be your pastor all of these years.

The Church needs thankful and grateful people; people who give thanks to God for the gracious love and sacrifice of the Lord Jesus, and who deeply love each other with the gracious love of Christ.
