Dear Beloved Church,

When I was first contacted by Don Caisley by the Interim Search Committee, I wasn't even sure where Joliet Illinois was. And even though Tim and I were living in the warmth of Florida, harboring no thoughts of getting cold ever again, I looked First Pres Joliet up on the internet. Of all the churches I was talking with this church wowed me from the start. The architecture, windows and worship opened up my mind to the possibilities that this was where God was sending me. I started to listen to recordings of the choir and watch worship on line. The preaching was Spirit led, the Chancel Choir incredible, the Worship band phenomenal. Then I discovered First also has something very few church's have in this day and age... a bell choir! The Glory Ringers fill my heart with joy!

Thinking the Christian Duet "Water Within" was part of your music program I actually emailed my children a video of them. They are so good!
