Happy Holy Week Beloved of God!

Tomorrow, Maundy Thursday, April 14th at 6:30pm, the faithful of First Presbyterian Church of Joliet will gather together to re-live, through music and God's Holy Word, the last hours of Christ's life on earth.

Tenebrae is an ancient form of worship where the sanctuary grows increasingly darker as the light of this world, our Lord Jesus the Christ, is beaten and scorned and forcibly taken from those who loved Him through death on a cross. The Word, the music, the hymns we will sing will help to transport us into a deeper understanding of what God sacrificed out of love for us. I believe you will discover that Tenebrae is transformative.

A new and different worship will be held at First Joliet this Good Friday, April 15th at 6:30pm. A NOTE FROM PASTOR BO:

Updates from 805 Western! This past week has been a great week of ministry here at 1st Pres. If you're out of the loop with what happened last week let me try to catch you up:

- Saturday - We had a building filled with lots of laughter and joy, with kids excited about chasing Easter eggs (we had 1,600 eggs spread all around the church). Between taking pictures with the Easter Bunny (dressed in a tutu I might add) and all the crafts, the kids learned a couple songs and heard about Jesus and His friends. It was so good to see the little ones fill the church again, and to catch up with their parents that we had not seen in a while.

- Sunday - What can I say about Sunday? The Night Deacons did a terrific job, and served a really good breakfast that gave so many of us the chance of enjoying fellowship and catching up. During the breakfast we raised \$337 that the Night Deacons will match and send to the Canaan Church in Romania as part of our refugee effort for Ukraine. But the breakfast was not the only highlight on Sunday! We had a nice group of kids leading us in worship, singing and waving their palms, reminding us all of how important it is for us to come and rejoice in the promises of God.

- This morning I had a chance to reconnect with Pastor Ovi in Romania. As you can imagine, the last few weeks have been busy helping the people looking for shelter. This morning they had close to 60 refugees between the two camps they use for housing. Pastor Ovi expressed how thankful they are for everything that we are doing for them, and asked for our continue prayers for their ministry, especially in the next couple weeks as they are planning to drive into Ukraine and bring relief aid to the Ukrainian people.

Once in a while I get a question, especially on social media, about what do the Easter Bunny and Jesus have in common? And while some of the comments regarding churches losing their faith when they entertain bunnies and Easter eggs are pretty harsh, I want to share this with you: Faith is about redemption. A redemption that goes beyond just our own salvation. It has the ability and the power to transform culture. Karl Barth said at one point: "We must hold the Bible in one hand and the newspaper in the other." I want to encourage you to find that redemption in the things around you, in the family gatherings, or when you go and hide eggs for the little ones. I pray that in your celebrations and traditions Christ will be at the center of it all. And all of us will be better people of faith because of knowing that Christ has overcome not just prejudice, cultural divide, or anything else that we can think of. Christ has Overcome All.

Have a blessed Holy Week, and if I do not see you on Sunday: May the Hope of the Risen Christ be with you and all your dear ones.
