A Note from Pastor Carrie

Hi friends!

I am very excited to preach on this holiday weekend Sunday. A few weeks ago, we read Acts 4:1-13, and found that we live in a kind of an augmented reality, wherein we are empowered by the Holy Spirit to God's work in this very real, tangible world. In particular, Acts 4:13 taught us that although Peter and John were "uschooled, ordinary men" they so astonished the folks in charge that the leaders took note that Peter and John spoke with knowledge and authority, because they had been with Jesus.

Friends, **we** have been with Jesus. This reality is core to our lives, to our belief systems, to our choices. We may live in an "augmented" reality, but we are real people. This week we will take a closer look at what this means through the words written in Acts 4:23-31 and Psalm 111. What does it mean for us real people to live out our faith? This is the question we will ask ourselves (and hopefully answer!) this Sunday.

On the fourth of July, we celebrate the freedom we have in this country. It is a privilege to live here - to have the right of free speech, the right to gather to worship, the freedom to live our lives as we choose. As Christians, we have an even deeper freedom - the freedom that comes with forgiveness in Jesus Christ. Paul wrote in Galatians 3:26-29:

You are all sons and daughters of God through faith in Christ Jesus, for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus. If you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise.

I pray that we all exercise our freedoms with grace, humility, honesty, and kindness.
