Hebrews 10:24-25 says:

This Sunday I am preaching on Matthew 5:21-48. This is the meat and potatoes of the Sermon on the Mount, the 'how to', the hardest part to live in. Christ speaks to his disciples about how to live in a world that is corrupted by sin. From murder, to divorce, to adultery, and vows, all the way to loving those that persecute you. I can surely understand John Calvin talking about Total Depravity, about our limitations as human beings to live up to a standard that will reflect God's image. Where I get stuck though, is bridging the gap between our limitations and living in grace, in the words of Jesus:

"But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your Father in heaven."

Jesus comes time and time again saying: you have heard... but I tell you. This Sunday I would like for us to explore that part of Jesus' sermon: The Christ Centered life, the part that speaks to us being children of God.
