THE PASTOR'S CORNER Roy Backus, Transitional Pastor

Twenty three years ago on December 28, 1999, my family gathered in Milwaukee, Wisconsin at the civic center for Fall my graduation from Marquette, University. I had to arrive early for the last minute instructions, robing up, lining up, and all that accompanies commencement ceremonies. It was finally the day to receive my PhD in Historical Theology. The evening before we drove up to our motel and went out to eat supper together. Although my father had passed a few years earlier, my mother made the flight from Texas and was present with my immediate family. It was wonderful to see my family together.

I was very happy that Rev. Robert A. Wild, S.J was the interim president and would be presenting me with my degree. Fr. Wild was one of the most creative professors in the department. I knew that girls are pushed back from success and finding their autonomous selves. I celebrate their accomplishments, excellent choices, and spunk. The Lord has truly blessed us.
