THE PASTOR'S CORNER Roy Backus, Transitional Pastor

This Sunday we will consider Jesus' statements in the Sermon on the Mount, Matthew 5:13-20. He speaks to his disciples concerning salt, light and the law (Torah). We western civilization folks of the 21st Century and our post modern society, often miss the long held traditions of our Jewish, covenant fore parents in faith. Jesus lived those faithful traditions and brought them to life in deeper and richer levels. This is true with his conversations concerning salt, light and the Torah (law).

Salt: I can not count the number of times I've heard sermons, devotions, thoughts, etc., about salt. We know that it functions in cooking, healing, monetary trade, in all kinds of settings. But what about its use in Hebrew worship? Why did Jesus use this parable about salt and us?

Light: One of our clearest aspects of life is that of light. After salt, why would Jesus talk about light as a central metaphor for his followers? How are we light?

The Law, Torah: It's always amazing how Christians are conprophets, and affirmation by our Savior. Too often we quote our personal, favorite, limited opinions concerning Paul's seemingly convoluted understanding of the Law, or we misuse our Savior's debates with the religious leaders of his day. (A couple of points: Jesus never encouraged anyone to ignore the Law. The Apostle Paul never said that the Law was bad. Romans 7:12. "... the law is holy, and the commandment is holy and just and good."

I do not claim to have all the details on these eternal topics, but the Scriptures themselves can give us additional insights into our Lord's first teachings to the disciples of the past and to us, his disciples in the present.
