Many people say, "All religions are basically the same, and we are all trying to get to the same place!" Such a generality expresses an unwillingness to research and discover the radical differences in faith and practice in the religions of the world. When I taught world religions at Olivet College in Olivet, Michigan, I was continually struck by the distinctive differences in the world's wisdom traditions. As we moved through Hinduism, Buddhism, Taoism, Confucianism, Judaism, Christianity, Islam, and Animism we emphasized the particular insights and differences in each approach and meaning. I intentionally left Christianity til last, because I knew that most of the students had some insight into Christianity. As we approached our focus on Christianity, I found it essential to define what was distinctively original and different in our Christian faith. The true definitive gifts which our faith brings to the this world are the incarnation (God in flesh in Jesus Christ), and the death and resurrection of Jesus.

During our Lenten Pilgrimage we will take the time to renew Jesus' journey to Jerusalem with new eyes and understandings. We pastor's will follow the texts of the Women's One Year Lectionary. All of us will hear more of the women's gospel stories, which will help us experience the gift of salvation through Jesus through the eyes of their faith and discipleship.

Mark 16:9-15 tells a lengthened version of Jesus' post Resurrection appearances and message of faith. We will see how Jesus and the witnesses of the Resurrection see, tell and live his and their stories of hope and life.
