#### THE PASTORS CORNER, Roy Backus, Transitional Pastor

The Scriptures for the 4th Sunday of Lent emphasize love. Psalm 136 reminds us of God's loving care and leadership. 1 John 4:7-12 reminds us that we are to love as God loves. John clarifies that we are not of God, if we do not love. John chapter 3 shares the story of a religious elite who still didn't know the center of true love. Jesus fills him, and us, in with that center of true faith and love. (The fourth passage, Song of Songs 4:7-16 is a passage on human love. An honored, theologically trained, graduate school teaching nun told me that this is one of the few passages which should not be read from the pulpit. I trust her counsel. But it's in the Bible.)

We will spend most of our time with John 3:11-17. This story of Jesus helping Nicodemus is usually focused on John 3:16, "the Gospel in a nutshell". I want us to note that the truth of that evening experience is amazingly similar to the context within the church today. It seems we still don't quite get the truth within the heart of our Lord's ways in our times. I'm praying we'll see you Sunday morning.
