THE PASTORS CORNER, Roy Backus, Transitional Pastor

We just celebrated my parent's Wedding Anniversary. They were married on March 21, 1936. It was the first day the first day of Spring that year. They are together with the Lord, and I look forward to seeing them again. One of the many lessons they taught all of us was to keep an open, caring, loving heart. In other words, do not let our hearts become selfish, hard or bitter. Mother and Dad loved each other deeply, but like all couples, they had their reoccurring misunderstandings. Throughout their issues, they always knew that they were totally dedicated to each other in their love. They worked through their difficulties with patient grace. It was their way with one another. They extended their style of respect and commitment to other people too. They both believed that the Lord's people actually have a commitment to one another and to the Lord's work through us. I still remember my parents' prayers for the church they served and the individual people and families within it.

In their peaceful leadership of God's people they would quote Hebrews 12:14-15. They didn't quote Paul's inspired words to prove a point or win an argument. They quoted the passage, because they knew it was God's Word for them and all Christians. Too often we believe we can harbor ill feelings towards others in a kind of righteous anger. Many people waste huge portions of their lives, just trying to prove a point, to win, or not give in. All of us in our human, self centered stubborn ways do this. (This includes your transitional pastor too.) Paul, states God's truth to us:

"Pursue peace with everyone, and the holiness without which no one will see the Lord. See to it that no one fails to obtain the grace of God; that no root of bitterness springs up and causes trouble, and through it many become defiled."

We have a common call to serve Jesus Christ together. For God's sake, and our sake, we must renew our commitment to God's love through Christ Jesus for each other the kingdom. There are no exceptions. Let's keep our love of God alive as we show our kindness and keep our love for one another up to date.
