This past Saturday I stopped by to see the Night Deacons and our volunteers serving at St. John's Food Pantry. The Night Deacons have sponsored two Service Days and two Food Donation Saturdays through the food pantry. And you should know that we are looking ahead and planning other service opportunities like this. The Mission Council has been busy the past few months, with coordinating all the donations and partnerships with the many organizations we support, both locally and internationally. Speaking of which, Angel House Orphanage Scholarships will be sent out to Tanzania at the end of this month. Our goal to raise \$6,756 for the three girls has yet to be reached.
