THE PASTORS CORNER, Roy Backus, Transitional Pastor

Jesus' life continually catches me off guard. Just when I think I've got his earthly life figured out, that's when I'm caught off guard again! His experiences, actions, words and priorities, simply mystify me.

While preparing for this coming Sunday's service I read Matthew 9:9-13, 18-26. The experiences of our Lord in these few verses are similar to the others in the Gospels. Jesus has an ongoing debate with the religious leaders; he's eating with sinners; there's a call for his help by a father whose daughter is very ill; a woman touches his robe while he's on his way to do the healing; and there are misunderstandings between Jesus' words and those folk gathered around him. Pretty typical Jesus, Gospel stuff.

And yet, I was totally surprised when I read this text last week. In the flow of all the stories and situations there is a major shift of direction and flow. (Now I notice this in other Gospel stories too.) Jesus sets up the tax collector/theological debate, but as soon as someone needed his help, he cuts out! The doctrinal debate is second fiddle to the needs of a family. Even on his way to the healing, he heals.

Our Lord's gift of grace to people in need, which is each of us, always takes precedence over the well meaning debates about God. Why? Our Lord is a Lord of compassion and action. He lives faithfully in presence and action in God's will. You'd think that we folks who live by faith and love for the Lord would have figured Jesus' priorities out by now, but it seems that we are easily distracted from our primary calls to service of those in need.

So, come join us on Sunday morning. We'll see how Jesus spent his time on earth before his Crucifixion. His entire life was lived for us.
