A Letter from Transitional Pastor Roy Backus

Sunday School is a great place for growing up. I think about all the teachers who helped me know that God loved me and taught me the basic stories of faith. It takes a dedicated soul to invest in the hearts of children and young people. There's a great deal of energy employed which is invested in the hours of preparation for a brief hour of sharing, instruction, and relationships on Sunday mornings.

Now, everything we learned in children's Sunday School was not always accurate, and often we did not understood the lessons as they were presented. One area that is a major misconception in our present Christian teachings, is that the religious leaders of Jesus' day and time were not sincere or faithful in their religious practices. We read the stories of Jesus' confrontation with the Pharisees, Sadducees, Scribes and priests, and we choose sides quickly. We forget that Jesus was relating with very dedicated, sincere and faithful religious leaders. Jesus knew many of them well, and he could point out their personal, unseen flaws. Jesus was trained by many of these religious leaders. Jesus knew, and we do too, that a person can be sincere and very wrong at the same time.

What I'm trying to say is that Jesus' heated and pointed conversations with religious folk are the same discussions which apply to our religious practice. Each of us needs continued guidance and direction in our lives. (That's another reason for adult Christian Education!)

This week we'll take a new look at Mark 2:1-12. I encourage you to read the passage ahead of time. Pay special attention to the attitudes and the thoughtful conversations concerning faith.
