A Letter from Transitional Pastor Roy Backus

From 1959 to 1961 there was a short lived, ABC, parody television game show created and hosted by Ernie Kovacs. It was titled, "Take a Good Look." Kovacs was a master of creative comedy and he used his cigar smoking persona to get Dutch Masters Cigars to sponsor the show. Edie Adams, Kovacs' wife, was the "Dutch Masters Girl." There was a panel of celebrities, similar to What's My Line, To Tell the Truth and What's My Secret, who would watch stylized, odd, film clips which contained abstract clues of the guest individual's profession, accomplishment, or some other characteristic. I loved the show for two major reasons. It was visually very silly, and it started at 9:30 PM CT which was past my bedtime on Thursday evenings. (Actually there was a third reason, Edie Adams was really pretty.) Mom and Dad would try to guess the clues, and I was always impressed by Mom's abilities and Dad's frustrations. We laughed and groaned a lot. All I can remember from my 9 to 11 year old memory are a few short visual film clips, Kovacs and his cigars, and the bright, smiling, faces of the actors. My emotional feeling memories are a sense of lightness of being, warmth of family gathered together, my folks playing and enjoying each other, and the special joy of a young person accepted by adults, even when it was past my bedtime. Cigars! Kovacs! It was all out of keeping with our values and very limiting family television time. It struck a chord of childhood "getting away with something" while my folks kinda' approved of it. That brings high marks in a youngster's life! For the show itself, I remember the difficulties the famous guests had trying to decipher the odd clips. They rarely figured them out!

How does this connect with church? I have super enjoyed preparing and presenting the ancient stories of our foundations in the Genesis stories. For me it is taking a good look, a new look, another open hearted investigation of these stories of faith. I'm continually surprised how they speak to our contemporary settings and push us to reevaluate our relationship with God, others and ourselves. This week we will take a good look at Abraham's outlandish acceptance of God's call to sacrifice his son Isaac. How does this story speak to our hearts? I pray that we can take a good look and know, and feel, God's message for us. Our texts are Genesis 22:1-18 and Hebrews 11:8-19. See you all Sunday!
